What is representation?

'An act or service on behalf or in place of something or someone'

Egs. CSO's like YLF represent the people and government at the Community, District, Regional, and National level

Who sits at the table of decision

In almost every public engagement YLF had undertaken activities and ensured the inclusion of all manner of persons irrespective of their social, economic, political, religious, cultural and physical status

These persons include;

- Government representatives
- Chiefs/community leaders
- Assemblyman/woman
- Community people (The Aged, Adolescent, Pregnant women and Nursing mothers)
- Youth leaders representatives
- Key stakeholders
- Private individuals/NGO's, CSO's, FBO's etc.
- People with special needs (egs. PWD, PWHIV and others)

TAKING DECISION AT THE DISTRICT LEVEL/WHO IS HEARD/WHO DECIDES

Examples:

Authorities of the local assembly mostly invite persons or organisation with which the issues concern.

For example issues concerning health matters mostly involve

- Authorities of Municipal assembly (Municipal Chief Executive, Municipal Coordinating Director, Municipal Finance Officer, Planning Officer)
- Municipal Health Director
- Health Promotion Officer
- NGO's in health (Not at all times)

Authorities of the local assembly mostly invite persons or organisation with which the issues concern.

For example issues concerning security mostly involve

- Authorities of Municipal assembly (Municipal Chief Executive, Municipal Coordinating Director)
- Divisional Police Commander
- Municipal Police Commander
- Municipal Fire Service Commander
- Municipal Prison Commander
- Immigration Service Commander

WHO DECIDES/WHO IS HEARD


Examples:

DECISION AT RELIGIOUS LEVEL

(Making decision to favour them)

- Bishop
- Presiding pastor
- Church council of elders
- Church departmental leaders

Decisions taken at church level by leaders only is a result of what happen mostly in government. For examples; Pentecost General Headquarters decided the half year budget target for one area branch but the area brunch could not meet their budget target (GHS3,188,529.00).

Were duly engaged in the planning and facilitating of the **Gender Equality and Social Inclusion (GESI) project** at the District level.



YLF engaged Local level decision making (Community leaders etc.) at the "Higher table"

- Chief and Queenmothers
- Assemblyman/member
- Religious leaders (Islamic leaders, Christian leaders, traditional leaders)
- Youth leaders
- PWD's leaders
- The Aged
- Adolescents
- Pregnant women and Nursing Mothers



YLF engaged Local level decision making (community people) at the "Lower table"

People of an Islamic community called Agona Nkran including

- Aged/Adult
- Youth
- Adolescent
- PWD's (physical disability, HIV victims etc.)
- Pregnant women and nursing mothers



Who is missing
In most cases following are excluded in decision making:

- The youth mostly aged 15-25 years
- Adolescent between 10-14 years
- The Aged
- "Women"
- People with special needs such as PWD's etc.
- Sometimes community people whom the project is been intended for, end up being victims

Who needs to be brought in.

All kinds of Key stakeholders includes:

- Both female and male youth persons to ensure gender balance
- People with special needs. Eg. PWD's, pregnant women/nursing mothers etc.
- "Women"
- The Aged



Why are they missing

- Cultural perception (eg. Youth in Ghanaian traditional societies are not expected to sit with the elderly)
- Youth/adolescents are mostly not considered to be knowledgeable about the issues
- The perception that PWD's may not make realistic decision for their wellbeing
- Corruption: When beneficiaries are involved they will press on the authorities to do the right thing but the authorities do the opposite.
- Lack of motivation. Children and the youth are treated in Ghanaian society to be timid, lacking the confidence to participate in decision making.




