The **St. Germain School Complex**, our pride in education, flourished this year. We successfully engaged parents and concerns about the school and the children were tabled and addressed. This helped in consolidating our effort to support the educational needs of these students.

SAINT GERMAIN SCHOOL COMPLEX

In 2024, the generous donations to Young and Lonely Foundation enabled the completion of a much-needed canteen shed at Saint Germain School Complex (Charity School of Young and Lonely Foundation). This new facility provided shelter from harsh weather for both students and cooks, ensuring a safer and more comfortable environment. Support from Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc. (USA) and contributions from Mad. Karen Luckring contributed to the purchase of essential materials, including wood, iron rods, roofing sheets, and labor costs. This improvement is a direct result of your belief in our vision of creating a world where no vulnerable child is left behind.

St. Germain Vocational Training Center

At the heart of our commitment to empower vulnerable populations, the St. Germain Vocational Training Center was implemented to be a beacon of hope for young mothers seeking a second chance at life. Established under the umbrella of the Young and Lonely Foundation (YLF), this center goes beyond skill acquisition—it's about restoring dignity, sparking potential, and breaking the intergenerational cycle of poverty.

In 2024, **25 young mothers** were enrolled at the center—each with a unique story of resilience and a common aspiration: to create a better future for themselves and their children.

These young women are currently undergoing hands-on training in:

- Catering & Pastry Arts
- Dressmaking & Fashion Design
- Hairdressing & Beauty Therapy

Their children, meanwhile, are enrolled at the **St. Germain School Complex**, our fully-charity-based educational arm, where they receive **free**, **quality education** in a nurturing and inclusive environment.

This powerful ecosystem ensures that while mothers are being empowered with vocational skills, their children are not left behind. It's a **holistic model** that centers around care, education, and economic empowerment.

PUBLIC HEALTH PROMOTION

In partnership with Alliance for Reproductive Health Right (ARHR), we successfully launched the Gender Model Family (GMF), a strategy under the project "Putting Women and Girls at the Center of Primary Health care in Ghana" in ten communities across Gomoa Central and Agona West Districts. This phase involved community engagement, awareness creation, and the selection of Model Families. The project aims to promote gender equity, improve health outcomes, and empower women and girls in decision-making. Despite challenges such as cultural norms and time constraints, the community durbar ignited meaningful conversations on gender equality and equitable household roles, fostering community ownership and support for the project's success. Our effort touched 10 communities in Agona West and Gomoa Central districts. We trained and engaged 400 individuals directly on the subject matter aimed at effecting a systemic change in Primary Health Care access and delivery.

GAVI PSR 2 Community Sensitization

In the second quarter through to the last quarter of 2024, we again in partnership with Ghana Coalition of NGOs in Health, conducted successful community outreaches on child immunization across five project communities under GAVI PSR 2. Activities included mini durbars, house-to-house engagements, participation in Child Welfare Clinics (CWCs), which led to significant improvements in immunization rates, including the tracing of defaulters. Over 370 participants attended mini durbars, and 230 children were for example, immunized in August, 2024 alone. More than 2000 individuals, at the end of the project were educated and sensitized on immunization. The partnership with local health workers of Gomoa Central

Health Directorate of the Ghana Health Service, increased male participation and has positively impacted the communities, setting a strong foundation for continued success in future health initiatives.

WOMEN AND YOUTH EMPOWERMENT

A Seed of Hope: Scaling Impact Through Stewardship and Community Adoption

In 2023, we took a bold step forward in demonstrating the power of small-scale investment in transforming lives. Through our pilot phase, a single beneficiary received just 100 euros—an amount modest by global standards. Yet, the outcome was wonderful. Sarah, through guidance, community support, and the foundational principles of YLF, demonstrated entrepreneurial discipline, accountability, and measurable success in their chosen livelihood pathway.

This exceptional result sent a clear message: when empowerment meets stewardship, impact is exponential.

Motivated by this success, the Board of Directors has unanimously approved an increase in support **up to** \$500 per beneficiary to be rolled out in 10 carefully selected communities. These communities have been at the heart of our programming under the Gender Model Family (GMF) framework, showcasing outstanding commitment, transparency, and collaborative ownership of YLF initiatives.

Each of these 10 communities is now being adopted as "Sustainability Anchors"—model zones where integrated support systems will thrive and innovation will be locally driven. With women, youth, and traditional leaders acting as frontline change makers, we are fostering not just beneficiaries, but stewards of progress.

AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT/ FOOD SECURITY

In 2024, we explored our goal of promoting sustainable agriculture through mushroom farming. We engaged various stakeholders and mushroom cultivation trainings both international and locally to equip ourselves with mushroom farming skills. The pupils from our charity school were also introduced to mushroom harvesting and diets.

YLF also launched a fish farming project under its school farm initiative at St. Germain School Complex. With a 500-catfish pond capacity underway, the goal is to feed students and inspire them with sustainable livelihood opportunities. Despite challenges, our commitment to building a greener, food-secure future remains unshaken.


